Keynote Speakers



Joan Kuyek is the National Coordinator of MiningWatch Canada, a pan-Canadian initiative supported by environmental, social justice, Aboriginal and labour organisations from across the country. It addresses the urgent need for a co-ordinated public interest response to the threats to public health, water and air quality, fish and wildlife habitat and community interests posed by irresponsible mineral policies and practices.

Dennis Raphael is a Professor at the School of Health Policy and Management at York University in Toronto. The most recent of his over 130 publications have focused on the health effects of income inequality and poverty, the quality of life of communities and individuals, and the impact of government decisions on Canadians' health and well-being.



Ted Nolan was born at Garden River First Nation in Northern Ontario. In 2006 he rejoined the National Hockey League as a coach for the New York Islanders. Ted has dedicated his time to aboriginal youth in Canada and visits First Nation communities to speak directly to young people.

Michelle Colussi is currently manager of the Technical Assistance Division of the Centre for Community Enterprise, which builds capacity for Community Economic Development in a variety of rural and urban communities and organizations across Canada. She is an experienced facilitator, trainer, promoter, and consensus builder and is the author of several training and volunteer development manuals.



John Perry is Senior Advisor and Vice President for the National Quality Institute. He led the development of NQI Quality & Wellness Criteria for various sectors, including health care organizations, municipalities and the business sector.
